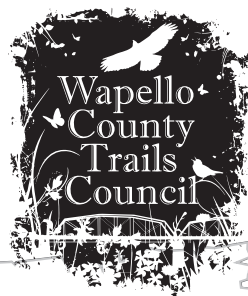


HOW TO PLAY:
